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Youth associations and youth education experts have been planning German-Israeli encounter programs for more than 60 years. Numerous projects and partnerships for exchange exist for decades and they are maintained by the same or by various group leaders. Good practice is passed on, however, time and again questions emerge in the process of planning the program which to answer is challenging not only for newcomers. How do we find the proper partner organization for an exchange project? Which thematic priority do we want to set and how do we organize a meaningful program appropriate for young people? How do we acquire participants and which young people do we want to reach out to? What role does history play and how do we connect it in a reasonable way with today's societies? How much fun is needed and which project do we want to develop jointly? Which educational methods can we use and how do we take into account young people's increasing diversity of individual and cultural identities? How will we finance the whole project? And after all, how do we communicate those issues with our German/Israeli partner?

### Language

Simultaneous translation (German/Hebrew) will be provided in plenum sessions. All the workshops will be held in English.

### Conditions for participation

The conference addresses professionals and group leaders of exchange projects in Germany and Israel.

German participants pay a participation fee of €80.00 and get their travel costs reimbursed within Germany after handing in the original train tickets (Deutsche Bahn, 2. class).

**Please note:** Different regulations apply for public servants. Since it is not possible to finance participation for public employees from KJP funds, the reduced participation fee of € 30 applies to them. Costs for overnight stay, breakfast and travelling have to be paid by the participants or their employer. The accommodation will be booked by ConAct. Final payment follows after the conference. We are happy to help for further inquiries in this regard.

Public servants are persons who are employed at municipalities, districts, federal states or the federal government and who accompany the German-Israeli youth and professional exchange within their employment status. Persons who volunteer for these public institutions are exempt from the scheme, as well as public employees who perform the exchange as part of a voluntary activity.

Israeli participants receive flight cost subsidies of €280.00. The flight will be reserved by the inviting organizations.

Lodging, conference program and cultural program is included.
